






A letter to my future teacher

#### Getting to know the Middle Years @ MOC

As a new Year 8 student you will join the Middle Years sub-school. The Middle Years @ MOC is Years 7, 8 and 9 - so you are not the youngest student in the school or even the Middle Years!

Middle Years students have home classes called Home Groups. You will remain in your Home Group classes for all subjects and are taught by a small group of dedicated Middle Years teachers who get to know you very well. Usually you will have the same teacher for English/History and Geography and Maths/Science will be taught by your other core teacher.

You will spend significant time in one building in general learning areas (**Building I3 or 20** - see map) moving to specialised facilities around the school.

Every Middle Years student is supplied with a personal digital device. In 2016 for Year 8 that will be an iPad.

Every Middle Years student is expected to wear full school uniform – your colour top is Blue. Shoes are expected to be black.

The school day is divided into three 100 minute lessons which equates to fifteen lessons per week.

During each week you will participate in:

- five lessons (500 minutes) of Mathematics and Science
- five lessons (500 minutes) of English and Humanities (History/Geography)
- five lessons (500 minutes) of either Health and Personal Development or The Arts or Design and Technology taught by specialist subject teachers - we rotate through each term.


Every student meets in their Home Group for the first fifteen minutes and the last five minutes each day.

In Year 8 there is a Pastoral Care program and that is taught by your Home Group teacher. Home Group teachers will take you for at least six out of the fifteen lessons each week.

In addition there is also a significant program of assemblies, award presentations, and MOC+ activities - our extra curricular program of clubs, study hubs, sport, and Children's University activities.

Twice a year there are **Exhibitions of Learning** where our Middle Years students
showcase their learning to their families with a focus on their project based learning.

### MY Support

#### Head of Middle Years

#### - Mr Nathan Elliott (2015)

The Head of Middle Years has many different roles in MOC, but the main role is to provide leadership to all the students of Years 7, 8 and 9 – the Middle Years.

The Head of Middle years is responsible for the day-to-day running of the sub-school and often has to make many decisions. They work with students and parents/caregivers at various times.



The school counsellor is there to support and help the Middle Years students when they need someone to talk to about school or other things going on in their life that are worrying them.

#### Your Home Group Teacher

The home group teacher is the person you will see every morning before first lesson and in the same room each day. The home group teacher will take the attendance, read out notices and will remind the class of upcoming events. The home group teacher will also teach you for some subjects and take you for Pastoral Care Lessons.

### Leader, Learning and Engagement - Year 8 - Mr Matt Ames (2015)

The Year 8 Leader looks after all the Year 8 students to ensure they are engaged in their learning through maintaining and further enhancing a safe and challenging learning environment. They work with your teachers to improve attendance and engagement of the Year 8 students. They also develop the MOC+ (extended school) programming of clubs, sport for Middle Years students.

### Dean of Students - Ms Colette Bos

The Dean of Students oversees the transition programs for all students at MOC. They also ensure we support our Students with Disabilities, Aboriginal Students and EALD students. They are responsible for our Positive Education (including Health and Well Being Program) at MOC.

### MY Responsibilities...


You will have some responsibilities at secondary school. We call them **Mutual Obligations**.

#### As a school we have:

- High expectations of students @ MOC
- A Middle Years sub-school environment that encourages students and staff to get to know each other well
- Classes as small as possible such that students have the best access to teachers
- A significant range of supports for students with learning difficulties/disabilities
- A 1:1 digital learning program
- A range of co-curricular activities including an expansive after hours program (MOC+)

We therefore have the following expectations of our students and parents:

- Students must attend school every day
- · Parents are expected to support their child to attend school every day
- · Students must participate to the best of their ability in their learning
- Parents must have high expectations of their student's achievement and support their learning
- Students must wear full school uniform
- Parents are expected to support their child to wear full uniform
